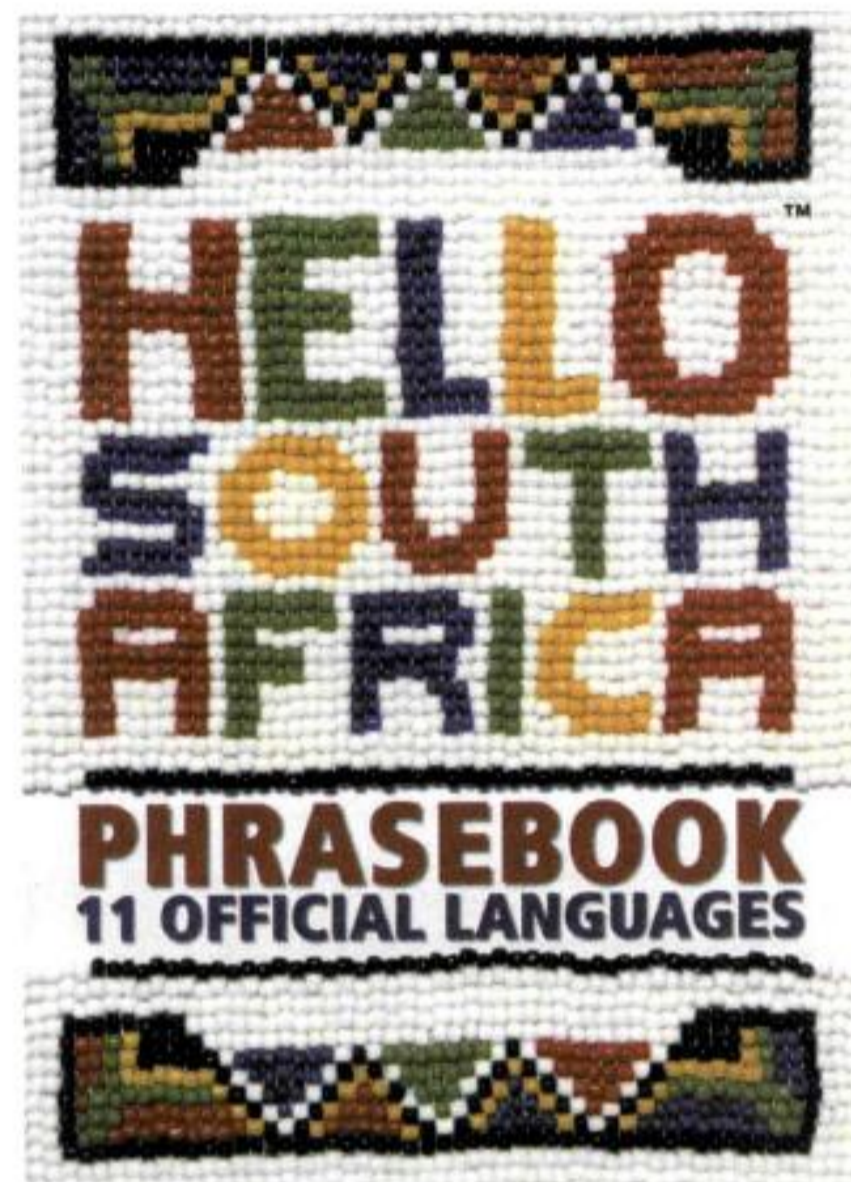
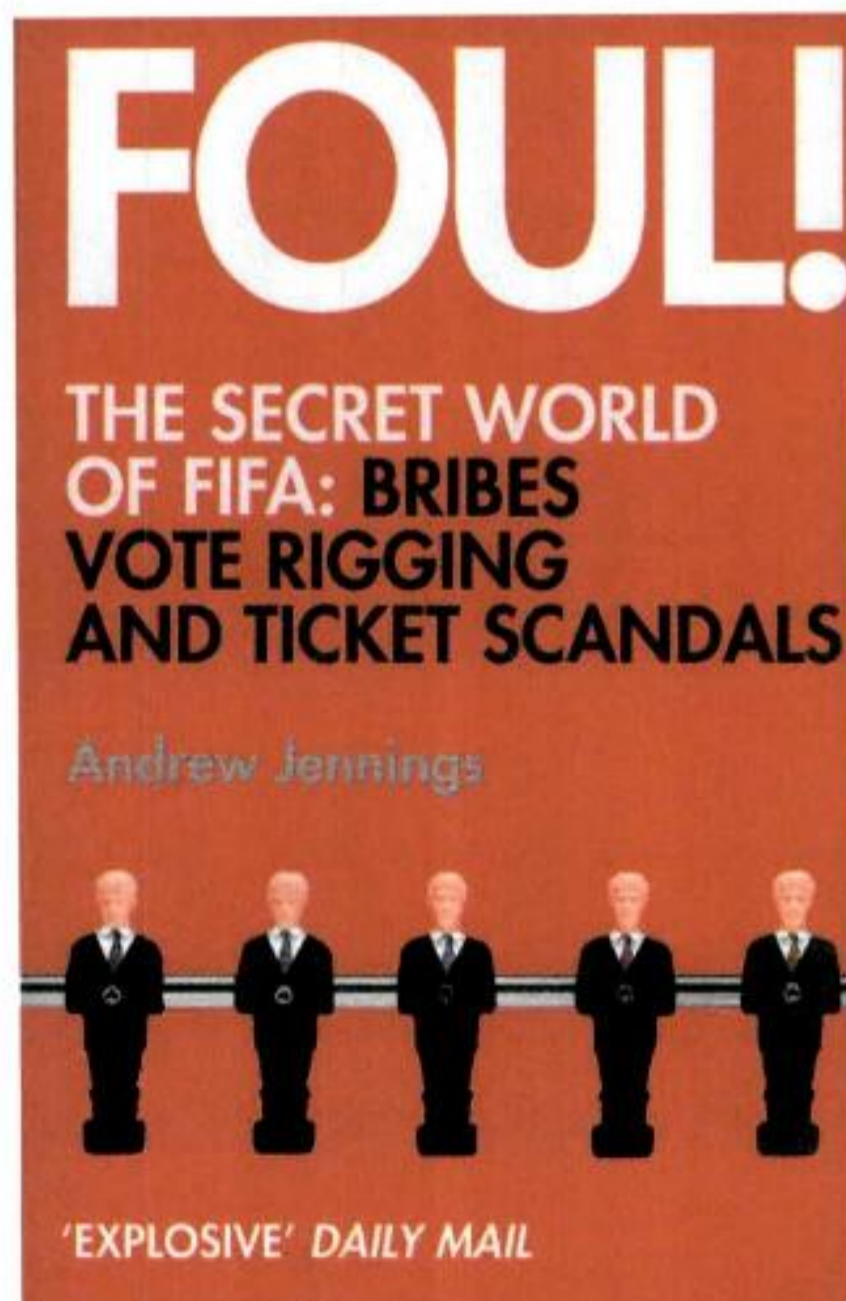
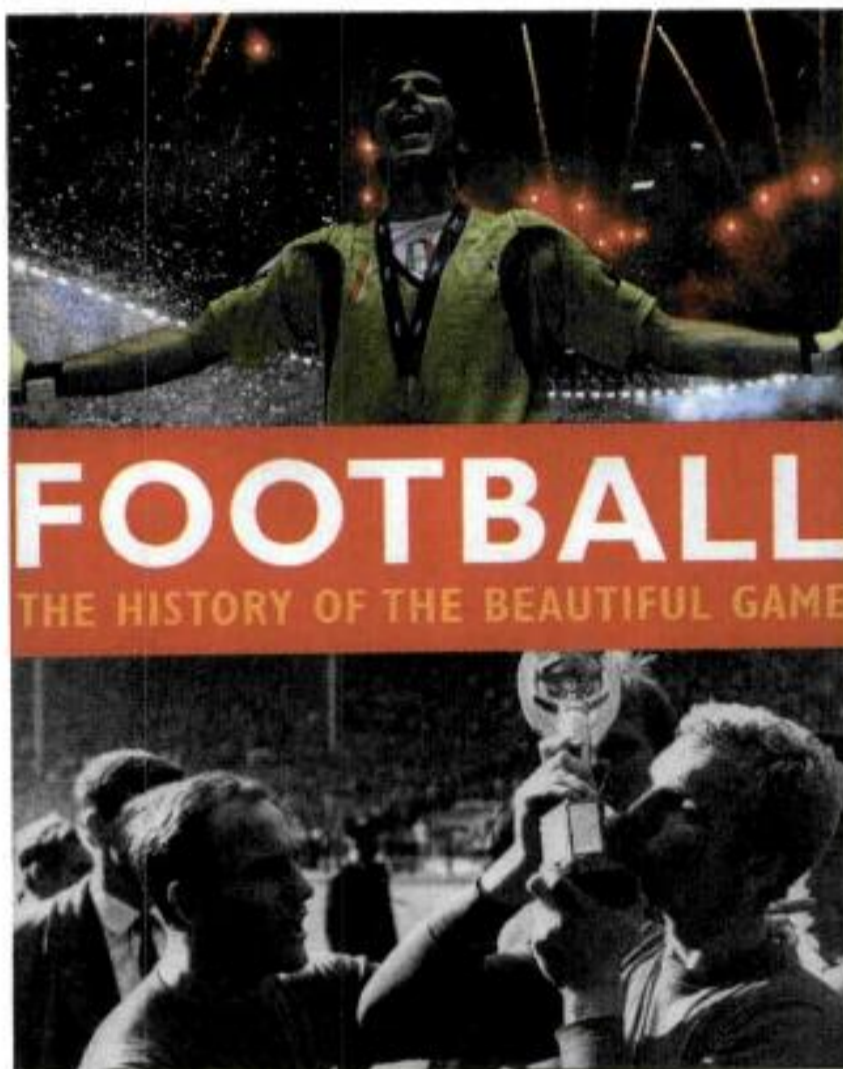
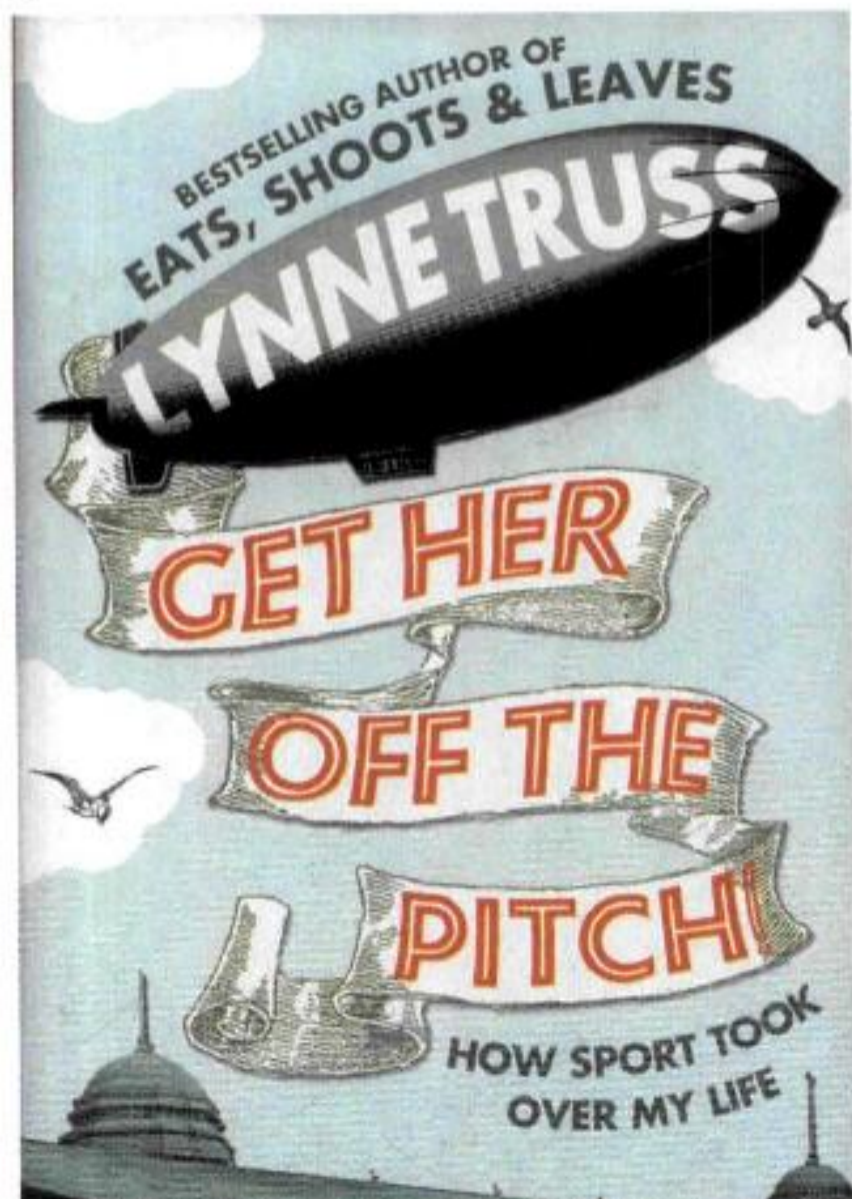


FOUR MUST-BUY BOOKS FOR JUNE
